7. LEGAL CHALLENGES – PARLIAMENT ACT CHALLENGE, HUNTING ACT 2004 & WILD MAMMALS (SCOTLAND) PROTECTION ACT 2002

Parliament Act Challenge: Sadly the House of Lords unanimously rejected the Parliament Act Challenge, 13 October, 2005. Not unexpected. The Human Rights case will continue next Spring.

Hunting Act Challenge 2004: Having had their application in the High Court in London for a judicial review refused last July, Brian Friend and Hugh Thomas lodged an application for leave to appeal Lord Justice May and Mr. Justice Moses decision on 14/9/05. Brian assures all UCSW members that he will continue the fight: "There is a long way to go, but soon these judges are actually going to have to answer the questions I put to them". The application for leave to appeal was heard in March 2006, with an outcome expected soon.

Wild Mammals (Scotland) Protection Act 2002: At last, 368 days after his hearing, UCSW member Brian Friend has a judgement from the Court of Session in Edinburgh. The Inner House of the Court of Session (the Court of Appeal in Scotland) dismissed Brian's appeal. He says that there is an automatic right of appeal from Scotland to the House of Lords and that is where he has gone. He lodged a petition of appeal in the House of Lords Judicial Office on 4 January 2006, presented to the Lords on 9 January, lodged the security on Friday 13 January and is meeting solicitors to the Scottish Ministers in Edinburgh to discuss processing the appeal to the House of Lords as soon as possible.
