#### 1. LEGAL CHALLENGES – HUNTING ACT 2004 & WILD MAMMALS (SCOTLAND) PROTECTION ACT 2002 & FIGHTING FUND

UCSW member Brian Friend will have his appeal against the Scottish Hunting Act in the House of Lords heard between the 10<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> October. The Countryside Alliance and Francis Derwin (Horse Dealers) appeals will also be heard during the same period.

The Union of Country Sports Workers launched a **major fund raising initiative** at the CLA Game Fair 2006 to raise £100,000 to support Brian with his travel, court, research and administration expenses. To date we have raised £25,000. There are no fees for lawyers or barristers in these cases as Brian continues to represent himself. #### 2. REGULATORY REFORM (GAME) (ENGLAND AND WALES ) ORDER 2007

The above order came into effect as from 1<sup>st</sup> August 2007. NB – for all those planning to shoot in Scotland, a game licence is still required there.

#### 3. REGULATORY REFORM (DEER) (ENGLAND AND WALES) ORDER 2007 – CHANGES TO LEGISLATION GOVERNING DEER MANAGEMENT IN ENGLAND AND WALES

Following the consultation which the UCSW was involved in recently, the Regulatory Reform (Deer) (England and Wales) Order 2007 has amended the Deer Act 1991, as of 1<sup>st</sup> October 2007.

#### 4. HARASSMENT OUT HUNTING

Brian Friend, UCSW Legal Advisor, having got fed up with the way the so-called Hunt Monitors were harassing his own hunt, the Cotley, pursued complaints about incidents on Boxing Day and New Years Day with the Avon & Somerset Police.

He finally got them to accept that they had a duty to protect hunt members, particularly minors, from behaviour *likely to cause distress*, such conduct being a breach of s5 of the 1986 Public Order Act.

With their help, he has produced a briefing sheet on this issue, which is available from the office.
